IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ATTENDEES

- 1. The Retreat will be held under the auspices of Dr. C.H. Wei, Chair of iNEER and ICEE-ISC. Concurrently, Dr. Wei is also Chairman of the National Science Council (NSC) of R.O.C. on Taiwan. The NSC, the counter-part agency to National Science Foundation (NSC) in U.S.A., has a broad charter. In addition to being the primary funding agency for education and research at academic institutions, NSC is also responsible for driving Taiwan's economic development using research and development, and has oversight on two science-based industrial parks with a third one under consideration. The first of these, the Science-Based Industrial Park in Hsinchu, one hour's drive from Taipei, has been given credit for helping drive Taiwan's economic surge in the 1980's and 1990's.
- 2. Meals and lodging at the Howard International House (HIH) for Retreat attendees will be covered by NSC during the period February 19 –24, 2002.
- 3. The well-known Howard Plaza International Hotels Group that runs five-star hotels in major cities around the world manages HIH.
- 4. HIH is a new 14-story facility in the heart of Taipei located close to the NSC. A part of the Civil Service Development Institute, HIH offers 10 floors of lodging facilities, a convention hall with simultaneous translation equipment seating 220, thirteen multi-functional conference rooms, a 25M x 12M Recreation Center with fitness facilities, a heated pool and jacuzzi, KTV equipment, and other recreation and exercise equipment.
- 5. Choices for lodging are single, suite, and luxury rooms. Restaurants on the premises offer buffet-style Chinese cuisine. There is a great variety of neighboring restaurants offering Chinese and foreign cuisine; however, pleased be advised that Retreat attendees opting to sample these will be on their own.
