A. Introduction

The year 2007 was notable for iNEER because for the first time, its global network of educators and researchers exceeded 36,000 in 98 countries. The Secretary-General performd networking visits to universities in Ireland and Northern Ireland, UK. To help advance education, iNEER organized two conferences, ICEE-2007 and iCEER-2007. iNEER Awards were given out in each of the conferences. A special archival publication, entitled *Innovations 2007*, the 7th edition of the iNEER Innovations Series, was published. Membership in the iNEER Network increased steadily and approached 30,000 by the end of 2007. The organization contiued to operate without charging membership fees. It continued to operate without any salaried employee, relying instead on support by a cadre of volunteers led by the Secretary-General who is contributing over 1,000 hours of personal time annually to the organization. The financial auditor, who continued to examine the financial operation of iNEER as in previous years, has continued to attest to the organization's sound financial position.

B. Visit to the University of Ulster, Northern Ireland, UK

During August 26-29, 2007, the S-G Secretary-General (S-G) of iNEER, Dr. Win Aung, paid a visit to the University of Ulster and the city of Belfast, Northern Ireland, UK. The University of Ulster, had proposed to iNEER to host the ICEE-2011 conference, and the purpose of the visit was to discuss the University's plans and to inspect the conference facilities. This visit was arranged by Dr. James Uhomoibhi of the University of Ulster in coordination with Belfast Visitor and Convention Bureau and Belfast City Council. The itinerary is attached to the end of this report as Appendix A.

The proposed conference venue for ICEE 2011 is the Belfast Waterfront Hall, located in the center of Belfast and designed as a multi-purpose venue with ultra-modern facilities to accommodate business, conference, arts and entertainment events. Besides visiting these facilities, the S-G also visited Belfast City Hall and paid a courtesy call on Jim Rodgers, the Lord Mayor of Belfast, who voiced strong support for bringing ICEE-2011 to the city. The S-G toured the Belfast manufacturing plant of the Canadian aircraft company, Bonbardier Aerospace. He also paid a courtesy call on the leadership team of the University of Ulster headed by Professor Richard Barnett, the Vice Chancellor of the University. While on campus, he visited the research facilities at the University's Institute of Fire Safety Engineering Research and Technology Centre (FireSERT).

C. Visit to Dublin Institute of Technology, Dublin, Ireland

Since faculty from the Dublin Institute of Technology (DIT) has been active in programs developed by iNEER, including conferences and book publication, the S-G visited the campus upon the completion of his visit to Northern Ireland. His visit was coordinated by Prof. Eugene Coyle, Head of the School of Control Systems and Electrical Engineering. The visit program included a courtesy visit with Prof. Brian Norton, President of DIT, and with Prof. Mike Murphy, Dean of the Faculty of Engineering.





D. ICEE-2007: Coimbra, September 3-7, 2007

The International Conference on Engineering Education, ICEE-2007, was held at the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Coimbra (UC) in Coimbra, Portugal, from September 3-7, 2007. It was hosted by the University of Coimbra and organized under the leadership of Prof. Fernando Seabra Santos, Rector; Prof. João Gabriel Silva; Dean of the Faculty of Engineering; and Prof. Carlos Sá Furtado and Prof. Maria da Graça Rasteiro, both of the Faculty of Engineering. The ICEE-2007 Local Organizing Committee at UC comprised of 12 faculty members representing all of the engineering-related areas at UC. They were divided into the following seven sub-committees:

- The Programme
- Sponsorships and Contacts
- The PALOPS (Officially Portuguese Speaking Countries)
- The Logistics
- Web and Communications
- Finances
- Marketing and Image

As Principal Sponsor, iNEER helped publicize information about the conference and invited submission of abstracts and papers by its members. An example of an e-mail sent to members

and is also posted on its website is reproduced in Appendix A. As may be noted from Appendix A, by including full details on topics and sessions for which the iNEER community was encouraged to submit abstracts and papers. iNEER also sent out reminders, as shown in Appendix B. An important innovation in organizing this conference is the series of informative newsletters sent by the ICEE-2007 Secretariat to authors who had submitted abstracts; see: http://icee2007.dei.uc.pt/newsletter.htm

The coordinated approach to conference organization adopted jointly as described above proved to be highly effective in stimulating interest in the community as attested by its response. By the close of abstract submission deadline on March 6, 2007, a total of 628 abstracts were received from 58 countries. The relevant statistics, including the final results on conference attendance, are as follows:

At the end of the process 455 papers were accepted, with 1146 authors. The papers were organized into 99 sessions. D. iCEER-2007, December Melbourne, Australia

The third iCEER conference, iCEER-2007, was held at the Rydges Melbourne Hotel on December 2-7, 2007. The second major iNEER-sponsored conference in 2007, iCEER-2007



was a collaborative event hosted by Victoria University to invite the international community to Victoria University, Melbourne. This was the first time ever that members of the iNEER Network assembled in Australia under the conference theme: *Innovations in Information and Communication Technologies*, with a focus on e-learning, problem and project based learning, government policies, partnership and collaboration, curriculum development and delivery, assessments, industry and community engagement, accreditation, globalization, integrated and flexible learning, and innovations in ICT education.



As of the closing date of abstract submission, 265 abstracts were received and reviewed, leading to 97 full papers accepted and presented. E. Publication and Distribution of "Innovations 2007"

Innovations 2007, the iNEER Special Volume for 2007, was published on schedule in July 2007. It was distributed to all participants at ICEE-2007 and iCEER-2007. The Board of Editors was comprised of W. Aung, J. Moscinski, M. Graca Rasteiro, Ian Rouse, B. Wagner and P. Willmot. This hardcover book has 47 chapters, selected from 58 articles submitted by 121 authors from 18 countries, with 186 reviewers from 26 countries providing expert advice on the technical merit. I. Joint iNEER Board-ISC Meeting, Coimbra, Portugal, (September 2, 2007)

The first of two Joint Meetings of the iNEER Board and the iNEER ICEE and iCEER International Steering Committees (ISC) was held in the "Sala de Reunioes" Room at the Main Building of the Faculty of Science and Technology at the Polo II campus of University of Coimbra (UC). The meeting was co-chaired by Tomas Cermak, Chair, iNEER Board and Rector of VSB-Technical University of Ostrava, and Fernando Seabra Santos, Honorary Chair, ICEE-2007 and Rector of the University of Coimbra (substituted by Professor Pedro Manuel Tavares Lopes de Andrade Saraiva, Vice Rector). Attendance was about 40, comprising of members of the iNEER Board and ISC, and faculty of UC. The meeting was preceded by a luncheon.

Following welcome and introductions, the Joint Meeting started with an update on iNEER programs and activities by Win Aung. Angelo Perna, the iNEER Treasurer, presented the financial report. The final report on ICEE-2006 (San Juan, Puerto Rico) was presented by Anand Sharma. Carlos Furtado gave a report on ICEE-2007 planning and results (see Sec. D above).

Updates for future conferences were given in the order shown below: iCEER-2007 (Ian Rouse; Australia) ICEE-2008 (Josef Mecsi and Peter Moson; Hungary) ICEE-2009 (Kwang Sun Kim and Sung-Goon Kang; South Korea) ICEE-2010 (Uriel Cukierman; Argentina)

The following new proposals were then presented: ICEE-2011 (James Uhomoibhi; UK) ICEE-2011 (Olli Martenan; Finland) iCEER-2011 (Wei-Chung Wang, ROC)

David Chang gave an update on work being done by the Leadership Council. He reminded members about the special workshop being sponsored by the Council.

The chair of the iNEER Awards Committee, Prof. Wojciech Zielinski, provided a report on the activities of the Committee and detailed the awards scheduled for presentation suring the conference banquet.

There followed a report by Kirsten Ribuon on the underpresentation of women in science and engineering in Norway. She described efforts underway at the Oslo University College to address the problem. Her focus was on efforts to help female students succeed, using aproaches that included memtoring and networking.

The meeting concluded with a presentation of a proposal by James Uhomoibhi for the formation within iNEER of a Committee Committee for International Development.

The meeting adjourned at 4:15 PM to allow participants to attend the conference concert.

J. Joint iNEER Board-ISC Meeting, Melbourne, Australia, (December 2, 2007)

A joint iNEER Board-ISC Meeting was held from 4 pm – 5:30 pm on Sunday, December 2, 2007 at the Rydges Melbourne Hotel, in Melbourne, Australia. In attendance were: Tomas Cermak, Vojislav Ilic, Tibor Kukai, Olli Martenan, Josef Mecsi, Norman Muyco, Ian Rouse, C.H. Wei, Peter Willmot, Win Aung, and other invited guests and observers.

The meeting was co-chaired by Tomas Cermak and Ian Rouse with Win Aung serving as secretary. Following welcoming remarks by the co-chairs and introductions around the table, W. Aung summarized and reiterated discussion held at the last iNEER Board/ISC meeting held in Coimbra in September, 2007.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS:

- 1. The International Network for Engineering Education and Research, Inc. (iNEER) is a Maryland-based non-profit organization, which was incorporated on July 16, 2002 as a Maryland corporation. Through collaboration in education and research, the iNEER works with members from both industrialized and developing nations to develop a global network of educators and researchers to help advance education and research around the world, and to achieve mutual progress through international exchanges and linkages, formation of cooperative partnerships, and information sharing to enhance the education experience for students. Membership in iNEER is free of charge
- A letter dated July 16, 2003 from Internal Revenue Service establishes the following rulings: (1) accounting period ending: December 31; (2) foundation status classification: 509(a)(2); (3) advance ruling periods to begin July 16, 2002; (4) advance ruling period to end December 31, 2006; and (5) addendum not applied.
- The Secretariat headquarters are divided between the New Jersey Secretariat, which is located at New Jersey Institute of Technology, Newark, New Jersey, and the Maryland Secretariat, which is located in Potomac, Maryland.
- 4. A comparative analysis of income and expenditures for two secretariat locations mentioned above for the past two years follows:

- 5. The reimbursement check #1098 dated 12/11/07 included a reimbursement for air travel in the amount of \$4,200. Upon review in early 2008, it was found that the claim amount was erroneous and should have been only \$1,700. The difference was immediately refunded to iNEER and the journal postings will be made in 2008.
- 6. Although financial activities in both secretariat locations are combined and treated as one activity for financial reporting and audit purposes, it is treated separately for income tax reporting purpose. For tax reporting purpose, iNEER's activities at New Jersey are incorporated into the educational funds of New Jersey Institute of Technology. As to the activities in Maryland secretariat, Form 990 has been prepared and mailed separately to Internal Revenue Service Center, located at Ogden, UT 84201-0027.
