SUSAN M. BRAYS, USA, Member

Sue Brays is Assistant Dean for Strategy and Development, Professional and Distance Education, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Troy NY. In addition, she is Executive Director of "New Vistas....support for distance learning" a consulting practice founded to assist universities, corporations and government agencies in the implementation of distance learning programs. Sue served as founding Director of the Rensselaer Satellite Video Program (RSVP), the distance-learning program of Rensselaer and led it from its inception in 1987 until her departure in January 1997 to found New Vistas. She served on the 2002 Awards Committee.

JOHN D. CARPINELLI, USA, Member and Secretary

John Carpinelli is an Associate Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering at the New Jersey Institute of Technology, Newark, NJ, USA. He received the B. JOSEF MECSI, Hungary, Member

József Mecsi received his BSc-MSc in Civil Engineering from the Technical University of Budapest in 1969, his CSc from the Hungarian Academy of Sciences in 1994, his PhD and Dr. habil. from the University of Miskolc, the former in 1996 and the latter in 1998. IAN ROUSE, Australia, Member

He has authored or co-authored more than 100 refereed papers, review articles and book chapters and have been associated with approximately 40 presentations at scientific meetings.

WOJCIECH ZIELINSKI, Poland, Chair
