Unique Experimental Facilities for International Collaboration in Engineering Education and Research

Papers are sought for one or more special sessions on the above topic. Unique facilities can provide focus for a wide variety of collaborative activities in engineering education and research. Faculty sabbatical leaves, postdoctoral training, doctoral dissertations and masters theses, plus continued education courses, can be accomplished with these facilities. Undergraduate students can participate in summer internship programs and, as consequences, receive deeper understanding of the application and value of their related courses in physics, engineering and experimental techniques. In addition, high-quality measurements may be provided to assess codes and their detailed assumptions in courses on computational engineering. This conference emphasizes development of international partnerships in education and research. Through special sessions and partnership workshops, it provides opportunity for development of cooperative projects.
